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Certification Types

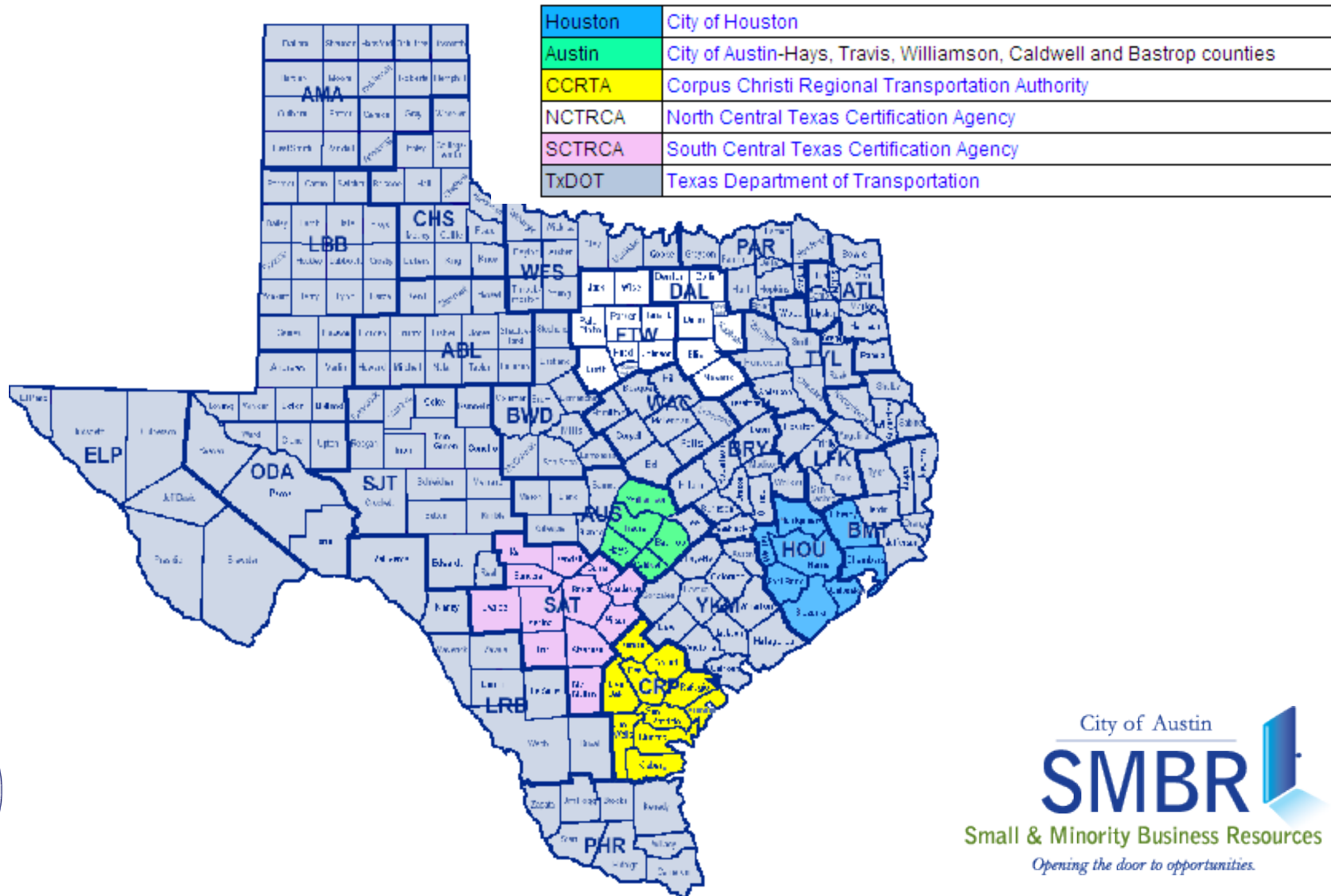
Types of Certification offered by the City of Austin	Certification	Projects/ Funding Source	Max Net Worth	Site Visit
Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE)	COA Certifies	City of Austin projects & funding	\$1,326,000	COA discretion
Women-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE)	COA Certifies	City of Austin projects & funding	\$1,326,000	COA discretion
Dual Certification – minority female (MBE/WBE)	COA Certifies	City of Austin projects & funding	\$1,326,000	COA discretion
Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)	COA Certifies	Federal funding	\$750,000	Federal Requirement

Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) is a certification program offered by the State of Texas.

The State of Texas now accepts City of Austin certified vendors as candidates for HUB certification for qualified applicants.



Texas Unified Certification Program



MBE & WBE Program

- The City of Austin's program for socially and economically disadvantaged business owners Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE)
- Business documents, MBE/WBE Ordinances 2-9A-15, Program Rules, and SBA's Business Size Standards are used to determine certification eligibility



DBE Program

- Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) is for federally-funded projects through the Texas Unified Certification Program (TUCP)
- The DBE program is for socially and economically disadvantaged business owners
- Business documents, Federal Regulations (49 CFR Parts 23 & 26), and business size standards are used to determine certification eligibility



DBE Program Continued

- US Department of Transportation (USDOT) funded contracts for Airport, Highways, and Public Transit
- Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) requires DBE Applicants to have a Federal Tax ID number



Airport Concessions

- Non-car Rental Concessions
 - 7 certified firms out of 21 concessionaires
 - \$6,973,094 or 22.71% of revenues
 - Total non-car revenues \$30,706,612
- Car Rental Concessions
 - 9 car rental concessionaires revenues
 - Revenues \$83,208,653
- Total Airport Revenues FY 09
 - \$113,915,265



Key Requirements

- 51% ownership, management and control by a minority and/or a woman
- Must be a small business as defined by Small Business Administration's (SBA) Small Business Size Standards
 - SBA Size Standards
 - Tax Returns
- Must have a facility located in Texas for a minimum of 90 days prior to submitting application




Key Requirements Cont'd

- Experience directly related to the firm's scope of work and management of day-to-day operations
- Personal Net Worth (PNW) or Alternate PNW (MBE/WBE only)
 - \$1,326,000 limit for MBE/WBE Program
 - \$750,000 limit for DBE Program



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City Of Austin SMALL & MINORITY BUSINESS RESOURCES DEPARTMENT



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The Small & Minority Business Resources Department(SMBR) assists small, minority-owned and women-owned business enterprises (MBE and WBE) as they pursue contracting opportunities with the City of Austin.

The program encourages minorities-owned and women-owned business enterprises to participate in City contracts by establishing special procurement goals for each contract type. SMBR sets MBE/WBE & DBE contracting goals in the areas of construction, professional services, commodities, and non-professional services.

To ensure that only bona fide MBE, WBE or DBE businesses participate in the program, SMBR has a comprehensive certification program. Only those businesses determined to be owned and controlled by minorities or women who are socially and economically disadvantaged individuals are certified. A firm designated as an MBE, WBE, or DBE will have its name appear in the vendor availability list. This document is made available to prime contractors and other procurement entities such as Travis County and Austin Independent School District.

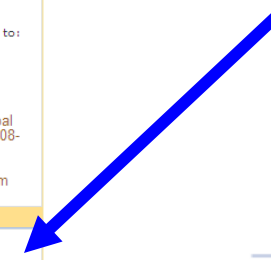
